WHO CAN COTA ASSIST?

Because the words **children** and **organ** are in our name, we understand there may be some confusion about eligibility. The Children's Organ Transplant Association (COTA) assists patients who:

- 1. Have been diagnosed by a physician as needing or have had a life-saving transplant (solid organ, bone marrow, stem cell, cord blood, or islet cell);
- 2. Are United States (U.S.) citizens or documented permanent legal residents; and
- 3. Complete COTA's sign-on process before their 22nd birthday.

Additionally, COTA supports patients of any age if the need for a transplant is due to a single gene disorder such as Cystic Fibrosis, Polycystic Kidney Disease, or Sickle Cell Disease.

At COTA, **our mission is our why** -- helping children and young adults who need a life-saving transplant by providing **fundraising assistance and family support** ... **for a lifetime**.
