Transplant Families, a program of the Children's Organ Transplant Association, unites families of children with solid organ or bone marrow transplants by providing education, support and inspiration ... helping patients and families make the most of life before, during and after transplant.

COTA's Transplant Families Program offers resources and family support at no cost and empowers families to build an educated, connected community at every stage of the transplant journey. Program offerings include:

► Education & Awareness

The annual virtual Pediatric Transplant Conference, held the last Friday of April, anchors National Pediatric Transplant Week. Year-round webinars and podcasts address important topics such as medications, milestones, school support, transition to adult care and more. Research Watch keeps the community educated and informed at every stage.

► Advocacy & Research

The Medical Advisory Council and national policy partnerships empower families to have a voice in the research and policy of tomorrow, advancing organ access, equity and long-term care.

► Caregiver & Patient Support

Caregiver Connect offers monthly family-to-family connection and expert-led sessions moderated by a licensed social worker. Totes for Hope delivers welcome care packages to transplant families as they begin their journey, because no family should feel isolated or alone.

► Community & Connection

A nationwide network of families, a monthly newsletter, and our storytelling program build an empowered community where no one navigates transplant alone.
